

October 26, 2015

The Wabash County Board of Commissioners met in regular session in the Wabash County Courthouse on Monday, October 26, 2015. Chairman Brian K. Hauptert called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with all commissioners present: Hauptert, Barry J. Eppley and Scott E. Givens. The proceedings were recorded by Wabash County Auditor Linda L Conrad. The minutes of the October 19, 2015 meeting were reviewed. Eppley made a motion to approve the minutes as written. Givens seconded the motion; it passed by a 3-0 vote.

John Martin, County Highway Superintendent was present with nothing to report.

Bob Land, Wabash County Sheriff reported that the Wabash County Jail currently has 81 inmates with 37 inmates housed at the Miami County Jail. Last week there were 17 new book-ins and 5 transports to the DOC.

Keith Walters, County EMA Director was present with nothing to report.

Steve Downs, County Attorney was present with nothing to report.

Jim Dils, County Coordinator/HR stated that prior to remodeling of the restrooms in the basement of the courthouse, some asbestos will need to be removed. Dils reported that four RFPs were requested but only two bids were received. Dils requested approval of the low bid of \$1,398 from Environmental Specialists, Inc. Eppley made a motion to approve the low bid. Givens seconded the motion; it passed by a 3-0 vote.

Linda Conrad, Wabash County Auditor presented:

1. Hearing notice for an unsafe building located at 1 Bent Court, Wabash, IN on November 4, 2015 at 9:30 a.m.
2. Letter from INDOT requesting comments on the proposed replacement of a bridge on SR 13 over the Eel River.

Ryan Wagoner, Business Manager, Living Well in Wabash County COA, Inc. presented for signatures the 3rd quarter invoice for the 5311 Public Transportation Grant. The commissioners signed the invoice.

With no other business to come before the Board of Commissioners, the meeting was adjourned. The commissioners will next meet on Monday, November 2, 2015.
