He also offered to help the county to complete the necessary steps to have the County Farm property ready to sell if the opportunity arose.

Tim Roberts, Sheriff: 66 in jail today, only 58 last Friday. Jail roof isn't leaking for first time since Tim has been Sheriff. He's having the water pump replaced in the emergency generator. It blew up when they did a weekly test. He's also having the alternator repaired, and has sufficient funds to cover the repairs.

Urbana Drainage project: Commissioners heard presentations from Gove and Associates and Butler Fairman & Scufert. Both are interested in involvement with the project. Commissioners took the matter under advisement. With no further business, the meeting adjourned.
