Jim Dils, County Coordinator/HR Director stated:

- 1. Phase II of providing Wi-Fi in the Judicial Center needs to be implemented, which will provide coverage on the second floor. Phase I, which provided Wi-Fi on the third floor, was completed several years earlier. A quote was received from Intrasect for \$1,311.24. Haupert made a motion to approve the request with the funding source to be determined. Eppley seconded the motion; it passed by a 3-0 vote.
- 2. Superior Court has added a third person to their office staff for 2018. An additional phone is needed and another data line needs to be run. Intrasect has provided a quote of \$935.00 for this project. Eppley made a motion to approve the request from Cum Cap courthouse phones. Haupert seconded the motion; it passed by a 3-0 vote.
- 3. The south door at the Judicial Center needs to be replaced. Specialty Technologies in Urbana provided a quote of \$1,042.59. Haupert made a motion to approve the request being paid from Cum Cap building repairs. Eppley seconded the motion; it passed by a 3-0 vote.
- 4. Day Reporting is now being housed in the former law library at the Judicial Center, however, the shelving in the middle of the room is preventing having appropriate workstations and supervision. Probation has requested that the shelving be removed. The county highway is willing to assist. Haupert made a motion to approve removal of the shelving by the highway department. Eppley seconded the motion; it passed by a 3-0 vote.
- 5. The highway department is needed to transport boxes of documents to be destroyed and junk file cabinets to be recycled. Eppley made a motion to approve for the highway department to assist with both requests. Haupert seconded the motion; it passed by a 3-0 vote.

Marcie Shepherd, Wabash County Auditor presented:

- 1. Accounts payable and allowances for docket ending 12/18/2017. The commissioners approved all claims.
- 2. The 2-1-1 Memorandum of Understanding. Haupert made a motion to approve the MOU. Eppley seconded the motion; it passed by a 3-0 vote.
